## **GUEST SPEAKERS:**

**Scott Clark** is the CALHN Clinical Academic and Senior lecturer for the University of Adelaide Discipline of Psychiatry and Deputy Head of Discipline. He co-coordinates the Adelaide Medical School's Psychiatry program and is a consultant psychiatrist in the Western Community Mental Health Service. Scott is the former Chair of the South Australian Clozapine Steering Group and led the introduction of a <u>state-wide</u> <u>monitoring system for the use of the high risk antipsychotic clozapine</u>. Scott's research focuses on the use of biomarkers and biotypes in the prediction of medication response and outcomes in psychosis and mood disorders. Scott was awarded the Royal Australian and New Zealand College of Psychiatrists Early Career Psychiatrist Award 2017 for his work on the <u>use of simple Bayesian models to combine multimodal clinical and biological data to predict the first psychotic episode.</u>
